Accenture Scholars – three undergraduate scholarships of \$20,000 each will be awarded to high school seniors pursuing a four-year undergraduate program at a U.S. university or college.

Accenture Fellows – two graduate scholarships of \$15,000 each will be awarded to undergraduate students pursuing an advanced degree at a U.S. accredited university or college.

Finalist Scholarships – two undergraduate scholarships of \$1,000 per year for four years and one graduate scholarship of \$2,500 per year for two years will be awarded to candidates for the Accenture Scholars and Fellows scholarships.

Candidates will have excelled academically and demonstrated leadership ability and commitment to community. Specific eligibility criteria are that the successful candidate:

- Be an enrolled member of a federally recognized American Indian/Alaska Native Tribe and be able to demonstrate involvement with or measurable interests in Native American activities or affairs.
- Be entering a U.S. accredited college or university as a fulltime, degree seeking freshmen or as a firstyear graduate or professional student.
 - Undergraduate: Attained a cumulative GPA of 3.25 or greater, on a 4.0 scale at the end of the seventh semester of secondary school.
 - Graduate/Professional: Attained a cumulative GPA of 3.25 or greater, on a 4.0 scale as measured by undergraduate transcripts if entering a graduate program or by current graduate program transcripts.
- Have demonstrated character, personal merit and commitment. Merit is demonstrated through leadership in school, civic and extracurricular activities, academic achievement, and motivation to serve and succeed.

Scholarship Requirements

- Students must be 1/4 or more degree American Indian, and be an enrolled member of a U. S. tribe. "U. S. tribe" is defined as federally recognized, state recognized, or terminated.
- Students must be attending or planning on attending a college or university within the U. S. on a full-time basis that is fully accredited. Study must be at the college level, and can range from bachelor's degrees to postdoctoral study. Applicants must have excellent grades, high ACT or SAT scores, some work experience, a track record of leadership, and a strong commitment to their Indian community.
- Students applying to any of these three programs are required to apply for all other sources of funds, write a comprehensive essay about themselves and their plans, and provide proof of high school completion, college admission, and tribal enrollment. "All other sources" includes federal financial aid, tribal scholarships, private scholarships, loans, and grants. The search for scholarships must be exhaustive, using the Internet, printed scholarship directories, and identification of scholarships in the student's local community.

Students should have clear goals about what they want to accomplish in life, and should have begun preparing for this work. Their goals must be related to the betterment of an Indian tribe or community. **Progress toward accomplishing a goal may be demonstrated by study, work, volunteerism, extracurricular activities, leadership roles, and letters of recommendation.** **Our scholarship program operates nationwide.** Scholarships range from \$500 to \$5,000 per academic year. Competition is very intense, with only 55% of applicants receiving scholarships.

This scholarship is funded by the Wells Fargo and administered by American Indian Graduate Center. To be considered for the Wells Fargo scholarship, an applicant must:

- Be an enrolled member of a United States federally recognized American Indian tribe or Alaska Native group;
- Be pursuing a career and degree in fields relating to banking, resort management, gaming operations, management and administration, including accounting, finance, information technology and human resources;
- Be a graduate student at a U.S. accredited college or university as full time and degree seeking;
- Have a cumulative average GPA of a 3.0 on a 4.0 scale at the time of application;
- Demonstrate financial need.

Scholarship amounts are \$500 for the first year, \$600 for the second, \$700 for the third, and \$800 for the fourth. Monies are paid directly to accredited educational institutions to be used for tuition, books, and other academic-related expenses.
